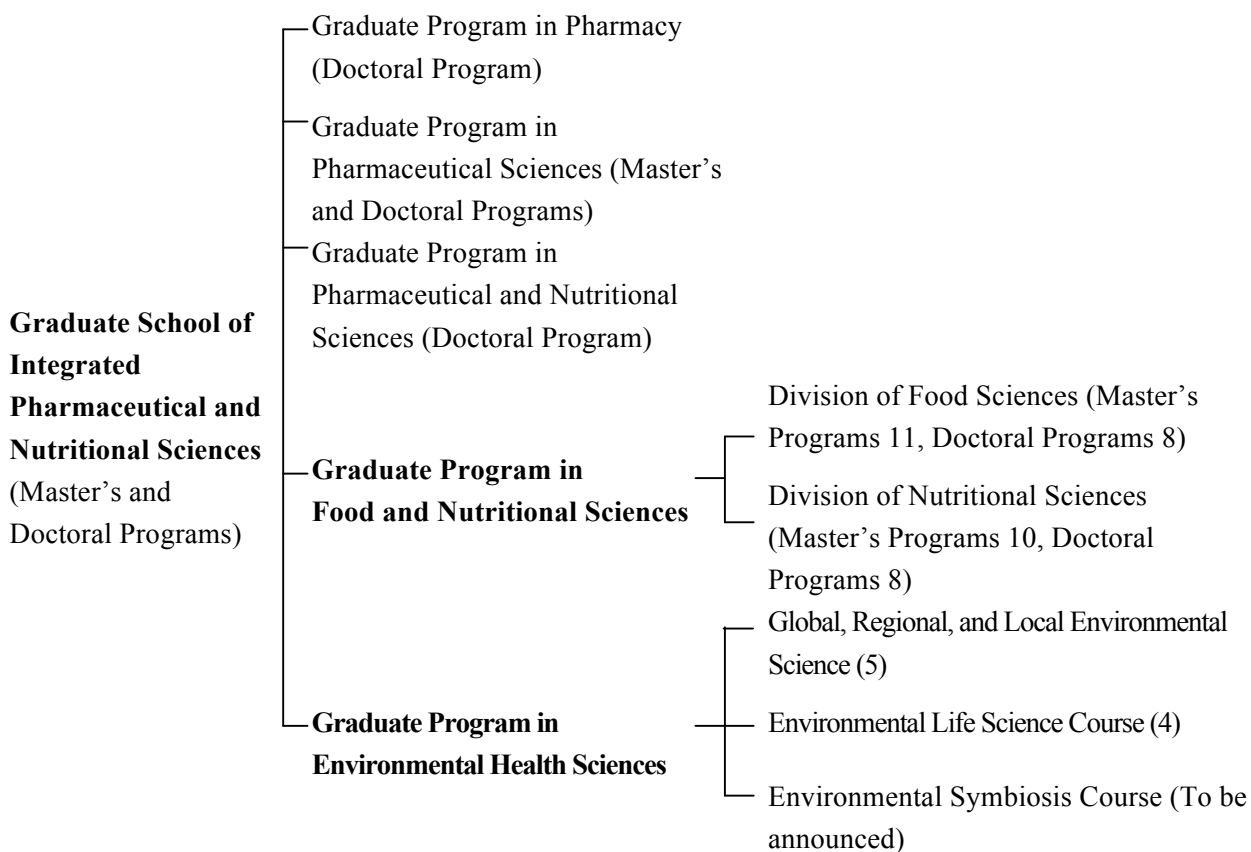
## **Graduate School of Integrated Pharmaceutical and Nutritional Sciences**

### **Graduate School of Pharmaceutical and Nutritional Sciences**

The School of Pharmaceutical Sciences and the School of Food and Nutritional Sciences were reorganized and consolidated to form the Graduate School of Integrated Pharmaceutical and Nutritional Sciences, which opened in 2012. We develop cutting edge Nutritional Sciences based on pharmaceuticals and food, and educate our students to be researchers and professionals with high expertise, who can contribute to healthy longevity as well as the creation of a safe and peaceful environment. The graduate school continues the research and education programs established with our university's 21st Century COE Program "Center of Excellence for Evolutionary Human Health Sciences," established in 2002, and Global COE Program "Global Center of Excellence for Innovation in Human Health Sciences," established in 2007, both of which were sponsored by the Japanese Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology. We have five areas of programs, and the Graduate Program in Food and Nutritional Sciences and Graduate Program in Environmental Health Sciences provide graduate education and research for "Food, Nutrition, Environment," which are key to the sustainability of the human being. Part of the laboratory that belongs to the Graduate Program in Food and Nutritional Sciences is used by the Graduate Program in Pharmaceutical and Nutritional Sciences at the doctoral level.

**The Graduate Program in Food and Nutritional Sciences** consists of two divisions, the Division of Food Sciences and the Division of Nutritional Sciences. Students learn basic science and advanced technologies in order to contribute to the food-based promotion of health and prevention of disease, and in order to become researchers or other professionals with advanced expertise and techniques applicable to rapidly aging societies. The Division of Food Sciences focuses on food functions, biochemistry, genetic engineering, and plant science, as well as to the chemical composition of food, processing and storage techniques, and food safety. The Division of Nutritional Sciences investigates biological response to nutrients, the molecular mechanism of cancer and its prevention, with a special focus on nutrition and meal management for the treatment of disease, as well as basic, advanced and practical research on the prevention of lifestyle-related illness.

**The Graduate Program in Environmental Health Sciences** consists of three courses: the Global, Regional, and Local Environmental Science Course; the Environmental Life Science Course; and the Environmental Symbiosis Course. Our students are trained to become individuals who are capable of seeing environmental problems from multiple perspectives, and who will contribute to the development of an environmentally sustainable society. In the Global, Regional, and Local Environmental Science Course, students study pollution from harmful chemical substances, as well as analysis and evaluation of the changes in regional or global environments, based on observation in the fields of atmosphere, water, forests and ocean. In the Environmental Life Science Course, students learn various life phenomena from microbes to Homo sapiens, and study environmental responses of organisms, the impact on the health of Homo sapiens by environmental factors, and prevention methods for protecting life. The Environmental Symbiosis Course focuses on the creation of a comfortable and prosperous environment for the future, and conservation of water and the soil environment, the supply of safe water, chemical substances and health, and the development of people-friendly and eco-friendly materials, etc. are the subjects of study. Individuals from a variety of backgrounds are welcome to join the program, including working people who are interested in the environmental problems faced by companies and research and development institutions, Japanese students, and international students.

## 2 Eligibility of Applicants

### First and Second Applications

- A Person who graduated a university/college specified by Article 83 of the School Education Act. (Including a person who is expected to graduate in March 2015).
- A Person who was conferred a Bachelors Degree in accordance with the provisions of Item 4 of Article 104 of the School Education Act. (Including a person who is expected to be conferred such degree by March 2015).
- A Person who completed 16 years of formal education outside Japan. (Including a person who is expected to complete such education by March 2015).
- A Person who completed formal education through a distance education program offered by a foreign school while staying in Japan, and is conferred a degree equivalent to a Master's Degree (including a person who is expected to be conferred such degree by March 2015).
- Person who was conferred a degree in Japan equivalent to a Master's Degree or a Professional Degree, after having completed the courses specified by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology, based on Item 4 of Article 155 of the Ordinance for Enforcement of the School Education Act at the educational institutions which are categorized by the school education systems in their respective countries, with graduate programs available at such institutions (including a person who is expected to complete such courses by March 2015).
- Person who completed special courses (including a person who is expected to complete such courses by March 2015) which are specified by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology separately, at the vocational schools (limited to courses which meet the standard specified by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology, and the period of study of such courses is at least 4 years) after the day specified by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology
- Person who is designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology in accordance with the provisions of Item 6 of Paragraph 1 of Article 155 of the Ordinance for Enforcement of the School Education Act (Notice of the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology, No. 5 of 1953: Including person who graduated National Fisheries University, Meteorological College, National Defense Academy of Japan, National Defense Medical College or Japan Coast Guard Academy).
- Person who has been enrolled in a university/college at least 3 years, or has received 15 years of formal education outside Japan, and who was recognized by the Chairman of the University of Shizuoka for excellent achievement in specified credits (including a person who is expected to be enrolled for at least 3 years or will complete 15

years of formal education by March 2015). “Person who was recognized for excellent achievement in specified credits” means person who earned at least 124 credits (including a person who is expected to earn such credits by March 2015), and at least three quarters of such credits are AA or more; S or A or more (at least 80 points out of 100 points).

(9) Person who is approved by the Chairman of the University of Shizuoka as an applicant through our Graduate School’s individual qualification screening procedure for having academic credentials equivalent to or superior to those who have graduated the university/college. Such an applicant must be at least 22 years old by March 31, 2015.

(10) Other persons who are approved by the Chairman of the University of Shizuoka for having academic credentials equivalent to or superior to those who have graduated a university/college specified by Article 83 of the School Education Act.

A person who meets any of (1) to (10) in section 2. Eligibility of Applicants, and who falls under any of the following conditions, may apply for a Special Screening for Working People:

- ① Person who has at least 3 years of working experience
- ② In addition to ①, a person who is engaged in research at institutions, etc. and has obtained approval from such work place.
- ③ Other persons who have received special consideration from the Chairman of the University of Shizuoka.
  - If you continue to work in a company or a research institution, etc., please be sure to avoid any problems between your workplace and your studies.

## <Special Screening for International Students>

A person who meets any of (1) to (10) in section 2. Eligibility of Applicants, and is not a Japanese national, and entered Japan for the purpose of education, may apply for Special Screening for International Students.

**Note:** Depending on the course, some lectures are given in Japanese only.

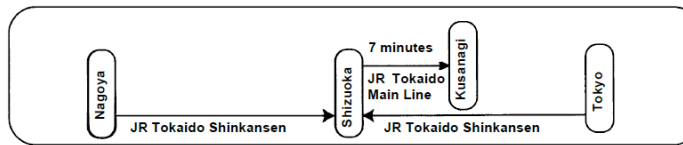
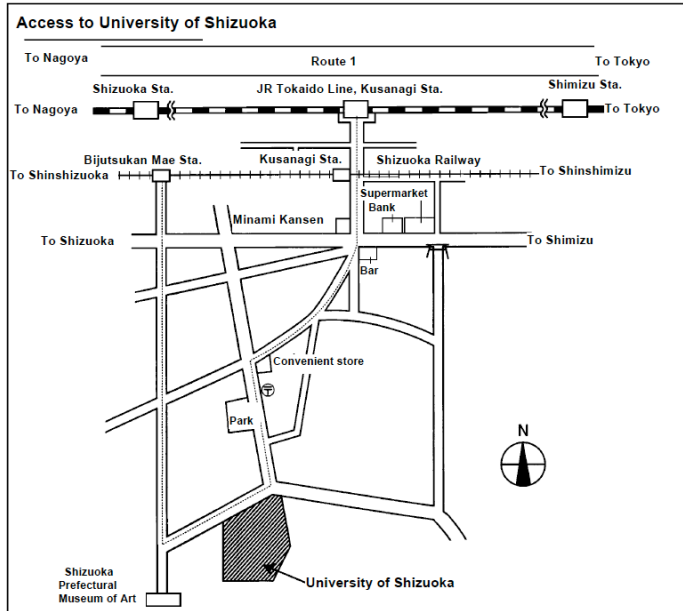

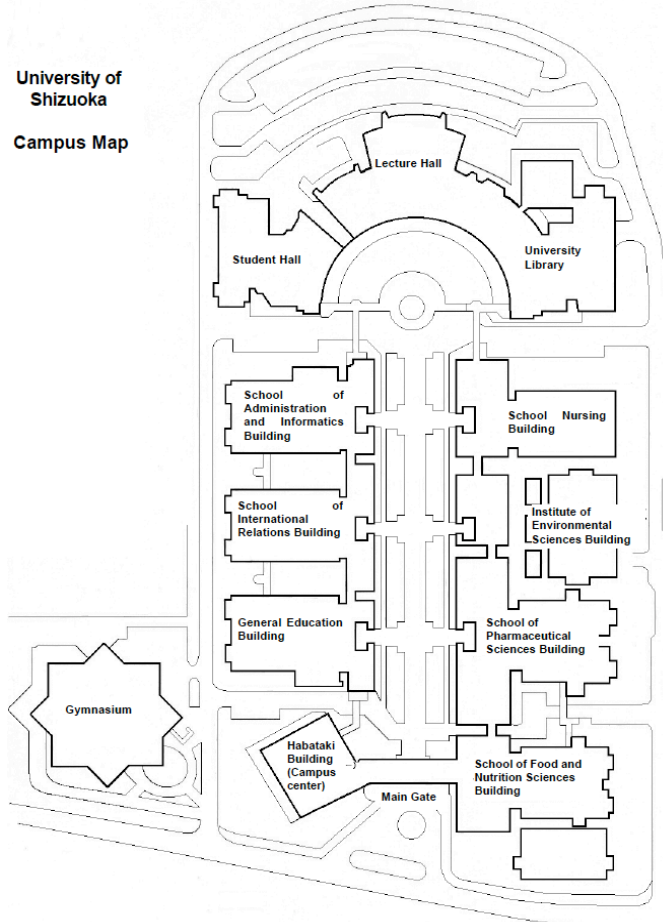

**On foot:** Approximately 15 minutes from JR Kusanagi Station or Shizuoka Railway Kenritsu Bijutsukan Mae (Prefectural Museum) or Kusanagi Stations.  
**By bus:** From in front of JR Kusanagi Station, take a Shizutestu Just Line bus bound for Kusanagi Danchi (Miho Kusanagi Line) and get off at the Kenritsu Daigaku Iriguchi (University of Shizuoka Entrance) stop. From there it is approximately a 5 minutes' walk.
